Graham E. Cooper, PhD, is a clinical psychologist on the Adult Psychiatry team at Kaiser Santa Rosa. His areas of clinical interest/specialty include Exposure and Response Prevention for OCD, exposure-based therapies for anxiety disorders, and cognitive-behavioral treatments for trauma (e.g., Cognitive Processing Therapy and Prolonged Exposure). Dr. Cooper received his doctoral training at The Ohio State University, and subsequently completed his APA accredited predoctoral internship with the VA Northern California Health Care System in Martinez, California.
