Nestor Davila is a License Clinical Social Worker with the Department of Mental Health and Wellness (Adult Services) with Kaiser Permanente, Roseville. Mr. Davila completed both his B.A and M.A in Social Work with an emphasis on behavioral health from California State University of Sacramento in 2014. Mr. Davila commenced his career with Kaiser Permanente in 2013 as an MSW II intern in the Adult Mental Health Clinic, Roseville. In 2014 he continued his work as Associate Clinical Social Worker and form part of our Adult Out-Patient Team where he completed all his pre requirements for licensing with the BBS. Mr. Davila obtained his LCSW in 2017 and has continue to work in the Adult Out-Patient Clinic in Roseville throughout his career. Mr. Davila provides individual and group therapy to patients as a generalist practitioner and serves a population that is 18-years and older. Tiffany began her career in helping families and children in 2006 shortly after earning her Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from CSU Sacramento. While working for a non-profit agency, providing case management and referral services to families in need, Tiffany began to see the overwhelming need for more mental health clinicians. She spent the majority of her time while working there in the homes of the families she was serving, gaining experience working within a family system. She returned to school for her Graduate work, earning a Master's degree in Psychology from the University of San Francisco in December 2014. This program focuses on an emphasis in Marriage and Family Therapy and prepared Tiffany for clinical work. Tiffany then joined Placer County's innovative approach to the Child Welfare system and worked as an ongoing social worker assisting families with reunification and preservation for nearly two years. Tiffany learned and

became experienced in using Safety Organized Practice (SOP) to assist families in working with the CWS department to develop strong natural support systems and creative ways of planning for crisis. Tiffany then transitioned to a newly developed team within the Placer County Sheriff's and Probation Departments to assist law enforcement with collaborative approaches at assisting homeless adults. Tiffany moved from this team to Whole Person Care in August 2017 and has developed skill and experience in completing biopsychosocial assessments, treatment plans with measurable goals and partnering with other agencies to assist the community's most vulnerable population. Tiffany completed her Associate hours and earned her License in Marriage, Family Therapy in 2018.

Tiffany has since gained significant skill and knowledge working with clients who have faced unspeakable trauma and utilizes a combination of attachment theory and Motivational Interviewing to partner with her clients in making changes. Tiffany enjoyed collaboration with partner agencies and building relationships with other homeless advocates for nearly 4 years before moving to the Placer County Adult Crisis Team. Tiffany assisted in providing crisis evaluations to hospital emergency rooms and in the field partnered with law enforcement. Tiffany then moved to a full-time clinical role with Kaiser and continues to develop skill in treatment areas focusing on attachment and trauma. Tiffany uses a combination of Acceptance & Commitment Therapy as well as research based Cognitive Behavioral Therapy techniques to assist her clients in growing and healing.
