Dr. Pham received her doctorate in Clinical Psychology from Northwestern University in 2005 and her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from University of California, Berkeley in 2000. Dr. Pham completed her internship at the VA Martinez in 2004, joined Kaiser Permanente in Campbell as a post-doctoral fellow in 2005, and worked at Kaiser Permanente in Stockton as a psychologist from 2006-2012. Drawn to the beautiful area of Marin, Dr. Pham transferred to the Kaiser in San Rafael in 2012 and has worked as a psychologist on the Adult team since then. In addition to doing individual therapy, Dr. Pham also runs a Self-compassion group and a Dialectical Behavioral Therapy group at Kaiser. Dr. Pham was also the ACE (Achieving Clinical Excellence) lead for the Kaiser in San Rafael from 2012-2019, where the goal is to foster a therapeutic culture of feedback-informed care for patients. Dr. Pham's love for learning and mentoring led to her decision to take on the role of training director in 2019, where her goal as training director is to foster and facilitate a safe, engaging, and personalized training experience for our trainees.

He joined the KP Walnut Creek team in 2005 and worked in all phases of the WCRChemical Dependency Recovery Program along with his responsibilities as Co-Training Director in the East Bay Consortium. Since coming to San Rafael in 2015 Dr. Oddo continues his work in Addiction Medicine and developing the SRF postdoctoral training program with an emphasis on intregation of care.
