Dr. Pham (she/her) received her doctorate in Clinical Psychology from Northwestern University in 2005 and her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from University of California, Berkeley in 2000. Dr. Pham completed her internship at the VA Martinez in 2004, joined Kaiser Permanente in Campbell as a postdoctoral fellow in 2005, and worked at Kaiser Permanente in Stockton as a psychologist from 2006-2012. Drawn to the beautiful area of Marin, Dr. Pham transferred to the Kaiser in San Rafael in 2012 and has worked as a psychologist on the Adult team since then. In addition to doing individual therapy, Dr. Pham also runs a Self-compassion group and a Dialectical Behavioral Therapy group at Kaiser. Dr. Pham was also the ACE (Achieving Clinical Excellence) lead for the Kaiser in San Rafael from 2012-2019, where the goal is to foster a therapeutic culture of feedback-informed care for patients. Denise Coquia, Ph.D. (Neuropsychology)

Dr. Coquia (she/her) is a neuropsychologist in the Psychiatry department at Kaiser Permanente San Rafael. She received her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology with an emphasis in Neuropsychology from Palo Alto University. Her past training includes externships at Palo Alto VA and the Kaiser Foundation Rehabilitation Center in Vallejo and a doctoral internship at the Kansas City VA. Dr. Coquia completed a two-year postdoctoral residency at the Kaiser Foundation Rehabilitation Center and Kaiser Vacaville Neuropsychology department. Dr. Coquia's current work involves outpatient neuropsychological assessments, ADHD evaluations, and co-leading an online ADHD Skills Class. She is also one of the assessment supervisors for the Kaiser Permanente San Rafael Psychology Internship Program. In addition, Dr. Coquia works with the Neurology department's multidisciplinary ALS Clinic. Her clinical interests include ADHD among older adults, the intersection of emotional and cognitive functioning, and cultural diversity within neuropsychology.

Sarah DeLuca, Ph.D. (IOP, Clinical Case Management, & DBT Intensive Program)

Dr. DeLuca (she/her) received her B.A. degree in contemplative psychology with an emphasis in transpersonal psychology at Naropa University in Boulder, Colorado. She received her doctorate in Clinical Psychology from Palo Alto University in 2019 with emphases in diversity and community mental health and meditation and psychotherapy. Dr. DeLuca is currently a staff psychologist with the Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP), Clinical Case Management, and DBT Intensive teams. She also leads an evidence-based outpatient mindfulness and meditation group called Inner Resources for Stress. Dr. Deluca has a recovery-oriented approach to therapy utilizing cognitive behavioral and mindfulness-based interventions including CBT, ACT, DBT, and meditation training.
